*The need for the change of the A/V system was never more apparent than on Christmas Eve 2022. The Christmas Eve worship is loved and watched by many, many people...and the broadcast totally and completely failed on Christmas Eve...and we heard about it!*

The new A/V system has all new components that are designed and proven to “work and play well” together. For good sound, throughout the facility. First time, every time. Training and support will be provided.

*The existing hearing assist system will also be available with the new T-coil hearing assist system. Some hearing aids only need a switch turned on to use the T-coil system. The existing hearing assist system will be available for all others.*

**Our progress so far: \$29,580 was given in the first two weeks of June, for a total given of \$64,481.**

## *From Dr. Shirley...*

Hello, brothers and sisters! Today, I read a short booklet, *A Simple Explanation of Confession*, published by Concordia Publishing House in 2022. Let me share a few paragraphs with you.

No one is perfect. Everyone makes mistakes. Sometimes, we may even deliberately do wrong things. What does God expect us to do when we've sinned? Simply tell the truth and receive the forgiveness Jesus offers.

Does God forgive only the specific sins we confess to Him? No—that would leave countless sins unforgiven because it is impossible to remember or even recognize all our sins. Whether we confess publicly in church, privately to a pastor, or directly to God in prayer, we can be confident that since Jesus carried our sins to the cross, we have forgiveness in Him. . . . God is more than happy to take away our sins and guilt, comfort us with His love and forgiveness, and promise us eternal life with Him. God knows each . . . of us is a sinner. We stir up His anger and deserve nothing but His punishment here on earth and forever in the fires of hell. But God loves us too much to let that happen to us—so He sent His Son, Jesus, to become a human, to live among us, and to take our sin and guilt upon Himself so that on the cross, God could punish Him in our place. Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, you are free from your sin. You never need to fear God's punishment. . . . you can know with certainty that God has forgiven your sins, and you can live in peace and joy, serving God and your neighbor in gratitude and love.

I am reminded of a Bible verse I memorized as a child, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9, KJ21). This is marvelous comfort and encouragement while we "Walk with God to bring new life and hope to every person".

# From the Call Committee

## Call Committee Update

As of the date I'm writing this article, we have had one candidate express interest, but they were not a good fit for what we need, so their name was not passed on to the Call Committee by the Transition Coach. This is a normal practice, similar to when an HR department filters the candidates that a manager would interview. We have specific criteria we need to meet, and not every candidate that would love to come to our church would actually be an appropriate candidate to serve here. So, we continue to wait and pray. Currently, the Call Committee is reviewing the interview process, and has selected our questions to ask potential candidates.

All candidates that pass the initial screening receive an initial interview. The initial interview is usually 30-60 minutes, and covers a few questions that the Call Committee has. The team leaves about 15 minutes for the candidate to ask question of the committee. This is a mutual process, and the candidate needs to get to know the congregation as much as the congregation needs to get to know the candidate. After each interview, the team will discuss the candidate, their impressions and reactions, and whether or not they would like to continue interviewing that candidate more. Our first interviews will all be via Zoom, since we need to be consistent with not only the questions asked, but in the method of interviewing. Each candidate will be asked the same questions in the same order.

Keep in mind also that the Office of the Bishop staff need discernment time to identify appropriate candidates, and this may take four to six weeks. The team that is doing this is small, and there are many churches in the Grand Canyon Synod who are in need of pastoral staff. Our Ministry Site Profile was posted on May 15, 2023.

Please continue to pray for Gloria de Cristo and the Call Committee as we continue to work for a successful pastoral transition.

*God, keep us mindful of your presence among us as we seek to discern your will for us. Help us see beyond our own needs to the needs of your whole church. Open our eyes to new possibilities and opportunities of being your people. Guide us and lead us O Lord. Amen*

## **Coping Strategies for Living with a Chronic Condition (Part Two)**

Mentally adjusting to being in a long-term chronic condition and how that can change your life can feel overwhelming. Many parents have comorbid mental illnesses due to the difficult nature of living with their condition. Our April *Evangel* article focused on strategies to help cope with a chronic illness such as Dementia, Parkinson's Disease, Arthritis pain, Terminal Cancer, etc. We listed several coping strategies that we will detail in more depth. In the June *Evangel* we focused on:

*Acceptance, Being Kind to Yourself, Talking About What You are Going Through, and Practicing Self Care.* Part Two will focus on the following:

### **Replacing Negative Thoughts with Positive Ones**

Negative thoughts are often unavoidable when you live with chronic pain or a debilitating condition. The key to reduce negative thoughts as much as possible and the most important thing is what you do when you have those thoughts. When you think something negative, for example "I'm always going to be in pain", stop yourself and replace it with something positive, for example, "I know that chronic pain can improve, this feeling will pass". It's important to realize that negative thoughts don't have to influence your behavior. You can continue to implement positive coping strategies despite any negative thoughts you may experience.

### **Finding Joy**

It can seem like chronic illness has taken all the joy out of your life, but this doesn't have to be the case. You can find joy in small everyday things, taking the time to really appreciate them rather than rush past them. For example, if you have a tasty meal or if you enjoy a program, take the time to really savor this and think about how much you enjoyed it. You can also find new hobbies which bring joy into your life and set new goals for the future. Finding purpose and motivation is vital. Continuing to strive for your goals despite your chronic pain is not easy, so having things that you are passionate about achieving can keep you moving forward and give you a reason to get up in the morning, even if you're in pain.

### **Practicing Gratitude**

Another way to have a more positive outlook on life is to find things to be grateful for. You can do this daily by listing things you are grateful for in your life in your head or writing them down. This could be family and friends, a roof over your head, a wonderful experience or a pain free day. Anything at all, however small or large it seems, can be included. A lot of people keep a gratitude journal. At the end of each day, they write down two or three things that they have been grateful for that day. This act of actively looking for the positives in each day can contribute over time to a more positive mindset. When you're struggling to find positives, it can be great to look back through your gratitude journal to remind yourself of things you have to be happy about.

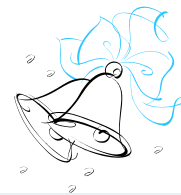
