CHANGE THROUGH THE YEARS

As I promised in a recent teaching, I will use some newsletter articles to reflect on the changes at Gloria de Cristo over the last 20 years. Change at GdC has never been done simply for the sake of change. Change has always been in response to a request, a need, or an opportunity for ministry.

AN EARLIER WORSHIP TIME

In the late summer of 2003, a concern was raised at the church council meeting about problems in the parking lot between the 8 am worship and the 9:30 worship. In the past, due to a long-winded interim pastor, the early worship ran over by 10+ minutes, and people were losing their religion coming and going from the parking lot. I suggested changing the time of the worship to 7:45 am, which was done, and it worked! It was the first change! (As a side benefit, members got to the restaurants before the LCMS or Catholic folks!)

FELLOWSHIP HALL USAGE

In the late summer of 2003, the Foothills Social Club was looking for a place to play cards on Tuesday afternoons. They would meet at noon for a potluck and then play cards and dominos from 1-4 pm. Because it opened the church at times that our congregation did not have programs, (GdC programs always take priority) the church council approved the usage and participants threw in \$1/person to help cover utilities. After 20 years, that increased to \$2/person. (Bonus: Senior citizens are kept entertained and off the streets for a little while! This has worked so well; we have added other times!)

Gloria de Cristo's facility is committed to serving the community.

Our God is a God who makes all things new and uses them for his purposes and has done that at Gloria de Cristo for many years!

From Dr. Shirley...

This month, some thoughts from our new Bible study, *Placed for a Purpose: A simple and Sustainable Vision for Loving Your Next-Door Neighbors*.

Many of us feel nervous about the mere thought of asking our neighbor's names, let alone sharing our faith with them. The gospel has not changed, but our conversations about the gospel have. Here is something that might encourage you. Eighty-two percent of non-religious people said they would be willing to have a conversation with a Christian about their faith if the Christian could do these five things (*though they didn't believe Christians could*):

1. Be Present and listen
2. Walk in their shoes
3. Find common ground
4. Talk like a real person
5. Create a better story

Rosaria Butterfield says, "God didn't make a mistake with your address. He knows what yours is as well as that of your neighbor." Lessons engage us beyond mere information toward new attitudes and actions. How can we deepen our connection to the people and place where we live? What does it take to find common values on which to build bridges of trust? Small acts can create a healthy community and a culture of neighborliness. In other words, "Bloom where you are planted, and let God reap the harvest!"

From the Call Committee

With the news that Pastor Timm would like to retire in the Fall, a Call Committee was appointed by the council. The members of this committee are Michelle Cegon, Kay Lee Grunst, Char Schomisch, Ted Duffy, Earl Marlatt, Sharon Merz, Gary Raasch and John Gerfen.

What does a Call Committee do? From our GdC Constitution and ByLaws – this committee will:

- a. seek the advice and help of the Bishop of the synod;
- b. consider the ministry and needs of this congregation;
- c. receive written suggestions, review, research, and interview applicable qualified candidates from the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of the ELCA; and,
- d. present their recommendation to this congregation for acceptance and issuance of Letter of Call.

The Committee is in contact with the Synod liaison and is completing the Ministry Site Profile required by the Synod. As we move through this process, we will attempt to keep you informed via an article like this in the Evangel. The prayers of the congregation are requested for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we consider all the options.

Mental/Physical Benefits of YOGA

The scientific research into Yoga's benefits is still somewhat preliminary, but much of the evidence so far supports what practitioners seem to have known for millennia: **Yoga is incredibly beneficial to our overall well-being.**

Benefits of Yoga That Are Supported by Science from healthline.com:

- 1. Yoga improves flexibility.** Yoga seems to be especially helpful for improving flexibility in adults ages 65 and older. Reduced flexibility is a natural part of aging, and a 2019 study found that yoga both slowed down loss and improved flexibility in older adults.
- 2. Yoga helps with stress relief.** Science supports that Yoga is excellent at reducing stress by learning breath work and relaxation movements.
- 3. Yoga improves mental health.** Both movement-based yoga therapies and breathing-based practices have been shown to significantly improve depressive symptoms.
- 4. Yoga will likely increase your strength.** Yoga's effectiveness at building strength has been studied in several specific contexts — for instance, as it pertains to people with breast cancer, older adults, and children.
- 5. Yoga can reduce anxiety.** Some studies have shown that the guided breathing and meditation techniques of practicing Yoga reduce stress and anxiety.
- 6. Yoga can improve balance.** Balance is essential for simple everyday movements such as picking something up off the floor, reaching up to a shelf, and descending stairs. Newer research suggests Yoga can improve balance in older populations.

Yoga has shown to improve quality of life, self-esteem, sleep, the immune system, bone health, better posture, and may reduce inflammation.

-Chair Yoga (1:00pm to 2:00pm or 2:30pm to 3:30pm) on Wednesdays.

-Mat Yoga is on Thursdays from 1:00pm to 2:00pm.

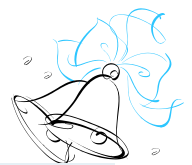
