

"Walking With Jesus To Bring New Life And Hope To Every Person" is the mission statement for Gloria de Cristo. That is quite an excellent statement. Have you ever thought of what it encompasses? Every person is not only those we see every Sunday at church but the new neighbor, someone having a bad day, people having a trying time with life and dealing with an illness. Often times we struggle reaching out to persons who might be strangers or someone we haven't really spoken to about our faith in the past out of fear of being shunned or having the person turn down our offer of help or friendship in their time of need. We need to remember that Jesus' followers were most certainly shunned and given a difficult time for their beliefs but that didn't stop them from reaching out to "Every Person" to help people find salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. We need to remember our Mission Statement and make and effort to fulfill our 'mission'.



From the desk of Dr. Shirley....

From the desk of Dr. Shirley . . . A **doxology** (Ancient Greek: doxa 'glory' and 'saying') is a short hymn of praises to God in various forms of Christian worship--typically an expression of praise sung to the Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. A **doxology** in wide-spread use in English begins "Praise God, from whom all blessings flow." Sung to the tune "Old 100th" the words are:

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow;
Praise Him, all creatures here below;
Praise Him above, ye heavenly host;
Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Amen.¹

The tune "Old 100th" is attributed to Louis Burgeois (1510-1561) and was used in the *Anglo-Genevan Psalter* of 1560 for William Kethe's metrical version of Psalm 100. It is the only metrical psalm tune preserved intact throughout the history of metrical psalmody.2 It is certainly one of the best-known psalm tunes in the English-speaking church. Different people at different times have subjected the rhythm to various adjustments, nearly all of which cause "train wrecks" in congregational singing.

My childhood churches all sang this as the "Offering Response," so it was something of a shock to me when I encountered changed offering responses in churches I attended here in Yuma. My son's church sings the words, but to an entirely different tune. We do learn to grow as we learn to fellowship in a wider circle of experiences.

Here at Gloria de Cristo, our expressions of liturgy change with the church seasons. At the season of Pentecost, we sing "As the Grains of Wheat" for our offering response. It is a short hymn of praise to God; therefore, it is a doxology. May our lives be a doxology of praise to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost as we walk with Jesus to bring new life and hope to every person.

CARE MINISTRY

What us Stephen Ministry? Stephen Ministry is a Christian organization founded in 1975 that produces training and resources known for their excellence, psychological integrity and the theological depth. Stephen Ministers provide care for care receivers — people in the congregation and community who are experiencing difficulties in life such as grief, job loss, divorce, major illness, spiritual struggles, and other matters.

This is offered at no cost to the receiver. Stephen Ministers meet weekly with their care receiver for an hour to listen, encourage, pray and provide emotional and spiritual support.

Stephen Ministers are not counselors, they are trained lay caregivers. Their role is to listen and care, not to give advice or counsel. They are also trained to recognize when a care receiver's needs exceed what they can provide. Stephen Ministry is confidential. Caregivers do not reveal what their care receivers have told them so the care receiver can feel safe in that what is being said during the session will remain there.

Who are the leaders of Stephen Ministry? They are pastors, church staff, lay people who share a common passion bringing Christ's love and care to hurting people. They use their common gifts of teaching, leadership, organization and care to hurting people. HEALTH & WELLNESS MINISTRY

Are You Getting Enough Sleep?

Despite how important sleep is to physical and mental well-being, you may find it challenging to get enough quality sleep each night. *The impact of poor sleep can be felt in all areas of your life. The sleep habits you follow each day – known as sleep hygiene – can have a positive effect on how well you sleep.*

<u>**Tips for How to Sleep Better**</u> (How to make it easier to fall asleep, stay asleep, and wake up feeling well rested.)

- 1. Invest in Comfortable bedding and mattress.
- 2. Block out light.
- 3. Minimize noise.
- 4. Set thermostat at a coolish temperature if possible.
- 5. Set an alarm to rise at the same time each morning.
- 6. Keep naps around 20 minutes
- 7. Relax for 30 minutes before bedtime.
- 8. Disconnect devices in the hour before bed.
- 9. Get 30 minutes of natural sunlight exposure.
- 10. Exercise for at least 30 minutes each day.
- 11. Limit caffeine after 2 P.M.
- **12.** Be mindful of alcohol in the hour before bedtime.
- **13.** Eat dinner a few hours before bed.
- 14. Limit nicotine use and smoke exposure.
- **15.** Reserve your bed for sleep only.
- 16. Get out of bed after 20 minutes if you can't sleep.

For most people seven hours of sleep each night is recommended. Talk to your doctor if you are having difficulties getting enough sleep. There are natural supplements that he/she may suggest. There could be an underlying problem that needs to be considered and your doctor can advise.
