MISSION STATEMENT

Transitions happen throughout our lives. Some transitions are unplanned. Some transitions are planned, and preparations are made for them.

Gloria de Cristo is coming to a time of transition as I end my ministry to the congregation, retiring on Sunday, March 30th, 2025. I have been praying and waiting for nearly 2 years for a new pastor to be called, just like you have.

Preparations have been made for this time of transition.

1) Lay Ministers are completing their training soon. More will start training soon. To ensure that worship and the celebration of Holy Communion each week will continue after March, the Council has sent a letter to the bishop requesting sacramental privileges for our 3 lay ministers completing their training and it has been granted for Dr. Shirley Ehler, Char Schomisch, & Judy Zeiss. Two more members, Paula Pegues and Jerry Randby will begin Lay Ministry training in January.

Lay Ministers will oversee all worship planning and the worship services, along withmaking sure that the every-day operations of the church go on as normal...better than normal, because the size of the team working on the details has increased!

They will be under the supervision of an ordained pastor and will keep things in good order until your new pastor arrives.

2) Stephen Ministers have been trained and have been helping with the care of the congregation and the community for over 21 years!

In January, 3 members will begin a 5-week Leadership Training Course: Sandy Corless, Niki Duffy, & Robin Marlatt. After their training, they will coordinate the pastoral care ministry of Gloria de Cristo, along with our currently trained Stephen Ministry Leaders: Michelle Cegon, Jim & Sherrie Wehrer.

More eyes, ears, hearts, hands, and faith will make sure that all will be covered for you during this time of transition.
